Chowan Perquimans Smart Start Partnership Training Descriptions

ITS/SIDS

Learn how to provide a safe sleep environment for infants in a childcare setting. Training is required every three years and within four months of hire for staff and volunteers, and family childcare home providers licensed to care for infants.

Zero to Three: Understanding & Responding to Abuse and Neglect of Infants & Toddlers – Part I

Participants will be provided information and resources appropriate for service providers of infants and toddlers on how these populations are affected by child abuse. Materials will cover defining child abuse and neglect, learning the prevalence of abuse and neglect in the infant toddler population and examining the impact of maltreatment on their development. Learning objectives: 1) Recognize how infants and toddlers are disproportionately affected by abuse and neglect; 2) Identify the prevalence of child abuse and neglect in the U.S.; 3) Distinguish between the legal and psychological definitions of child abuse and neglect; and 4) Recognize the importance of distinguishing between culturally based differences in parenting practices and child maltreatment.

Zero to Three: Understanding & Responding to Abuse and Neglect of Infants & Toddlers – Part II

Participants will build upon the information and resources provided in session I to use as best practices when addressing: 1) Responses and concerns about child abuse and neglect; 2) How to collect and record observations; 3) How to talk with parents about concerns; and 4) How to respond and take action when young children disclose abuse and neglect.

Fire Safety

Participants will learn the use of fire extinguishers and get information to help them learn about ABC's of fire extinguishers and how to perform visual inspections when having to make a split-second decision on whether or not to attempt to fight a fire or call 911. Training will also include how to spot fire hazards and how to access 911 system and changes to our community 911 procedures.

CPR/First Aid Training

Participants will learn how to perform CPR/First Aid. Also, learn the rules and regulations for administering both.

Nurturing Young Children's Social & Emotional Development

Participants will learn the definitions of social and emotional development, understand the importance of nurturing young children's social and emotional development, and the role of caregivers in nurturing social and emotional development in young children. This hands-on-training will give participants insight on key components including emotional awareness, emotional competence, social interactions, empathy, self-awareness, and self-regulation.
