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Construction Paper Popsicles

What you need:

- Jumbo craft sticks
- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Glue stick
- Markers, cotton balls, glitter glue or other household items.

Steps

- 1. Cut two popsicle shapes roughly 9" long out of any color construction paper. To make a stronger popsicle you may cut two pieces of cardboard in the same shape and color.
- 2. Glue the two pieces together with the craft stick in-between and poking out of the bottom.
- 3. Decorate the popsicle using markers, cotton balls, glitter glue, and any materials you desire. You may decorate just one or both sides of the popsicle!

Help your child learn their letters! Write capital letters on the plate, and lower-case letters on clothes pins. Have fun!
