Early Educator Certification (EEC)
The Next Step in Professionalizing the Field

Become part of the growing professional certification system. EEC is open to all NC Early Educators working directly with, working on the behalf of, or intending to work with children ages birth to twelve!

The comprehensive application may be used by all of us....faculty, professional development providers & coordinators, teachers, consultants, trainers, assistants, Smart Start & Child Care Resource & Referral Executive Directors, staff of state early childhood agencies and programs, early childhood associations members and staff and more!

What is EEC? EEC is North Carolina's certification system for Early Educators. EEC is an acknowledgement of an individual's verified level of educational achievement, based on a standardized scale. Education is the basis for EEC. Education is coursework taken at a **regionally accredited** college or university. All public community colleges and universities in North Carolina are regionally accredited. EEC does not replace teacher licensure and is designed to complement that process.

How much does it cost?

EEC is a self-supporting system, which has been created with funding from private and public sources with a goal of being funded primarily by individual fees when fully implemented. EEC fees are aligned with charges required by similar NC professions. The cost for an initial review is \$50. The fee for EEC recertification is \$25, if completed prior to the issued expiration date.

How do you apply?

- Complete and sign your application.
- Attach all official transcripts (for degrees and individual courses) to your application.
- Attach a check or money order
- Make a copy of all materials for your files.

- Workshop registration forms received by fax will **NOT** secure or reserve a space.
- There is a limit of eight participants per center/facility for each training and may be further restricted if the need arises in any of the Albemarle Smart Start workshops.
- The fee for a **duplicate certificate** will be \$5.00. *We keep training information on file for 3 years.*

- **When registering by mail**, please complete the registration form below. Enclose the payment for the required fee(s) and send to the address above.
- **Register early**. Some workshops fill up quickly. If the workshop you are interested in is full, your name may be added to a waiting list in case there is cancellation. After registering for a workshop, note the information on your calendar. We **do not** call with reminders unless the location or the time of the training has changed.
- **No payment** will be accepted at the training event.

Cancellation Policy

- **If you register for a workshop, please plan to attend.**
- If you cannot attend, please call us to have your fee applied to another workshop of your choice. You must call and cancel your attendance within two days of the training. Your fee credit must be used within that particular training calendar period.
- **Registration fees are nonrefundable.** Failure to cancel according to this policy will result in forfeiture of your registration fee. Sometimes, a workshop may be cancelled. In that case, you will be notified if you are a paid registrant.

Attendance

- **Only registered participants may attend trainings.**

Albemarle Smart Start Training Descriptions

Emergency Preparedness and Response PR in Child Care Training Session 1 & 2

The new Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR) in Child Care Training gives early educators information and tools to prepare for many types of emergencies. The EPR in Child Care Training addresses new NC Child Care Rules on emergency preparedness, current best practice recommendations, and guidance on completing the online EPR Plan. The EPR Plan template is found on the North Carolina Emergency Management website. The training is presented in two 2-hour sessions and includes a one-hour site assignment. NC Child Care Rules 10A NCAC 09 .0607(b) and 10A NCAC 09 .1705(b)(6) require that a designated individual from all licensed centers and family child care homes complete the training and submit a facility EPR Plan.

Be prepared! Knowing what to do before, during and after an emergency is a critical part of being prepared and may make all the difference when seconds count.

Note: Participants must attend part 1 and 2 with completed assignment to get training certificate.

Grief and Loss In Young Children

This session will define most common times of grief and loss for young children, identify stages of grief, discover ways children react behaviorally to grief and loss, and determine ways to support children through this process.

American Heart Association Adult, Child, & Infant CPR & First Aid

The Heartsaver Pediatric First Aid/CPR AED Course teaches child care providers and others to respond to and manage illnesses and injuries in an adult, child, or infant in the first few minutes until professional help arrives.

New Provider Orientation

Overview of the requirements for starting a family child care facility. Participants will receive helpful information on running a family child care business and preparing their home for the initial licensing visit.

(Note: If you currently work for a center, no credit will be given for this class until you are licensed as a family child care)

NC Foundations for Early Learning and Development

This 5 hour course will provide participants with an introduction to Foundations, North Carolina's new Early Learning and Development expectations, how they are structured, and how to implement them in early childhood settings.

More Than Counting and More than Science

Child Care Providers will be introduced to a variety of ways to incorporate math and science in their lesson plans. Also they will have hands on activities.

What's In Your Teaching Toolkit?

Participants will see tools for prevention of challenging behavior as well as tips, forms, guides and practical resources that promote problem solving skills, friendship development and social skill instruction.

Supporting Breastfeeding Families: A Guide for Early Care Providers

Is your child care center or child care home breastfeeding – friendly? This training will help you know how to support a breastfeeding family. Information about storage and handling of human milk and research - based knowledge of its benefits will be discussed in this training. Free resource materials are provided for each day care center or home. This is also an approved training credit toward the North Carolina Breastfeeding – Friendly Child Care Designation.

Pre-K CLASS Observer Certification

This training is designed for those desiring to become a certified Pre-K CLASS Observer. Gain in-depth knowledge about the Pre-K CLASS Measure and the way it organizes effective teacher-child interactions. Benefit from explicit instruction and guided practice in observing and coding with the CLASS tool. Sharpen observation and coding skills in preparation for the Pre-K CLASS reliability test.

Be Active Kids ®

Be Active Kids® uses colorful characters, interactive hands-on lessons and bright visuals to teach and encourage children to explore their natural surroundings, engage in playful experiences, and show children that physical activity can be fun. Each participant working with children birth-five will receive a FREE and NEWLY REVISED “Be Active Kids® Guide to Early Childhood Physical Activity.” The NEW movement guide includes over 75 developmentally appropriate physical activities for children from birth to five years of age. In addition, the guide provides physical activity guidelines and best practices, classroom management strategies, tips for modifying activities and much more! After attending the training, participants will have a chance to enroll in the Be Active Kids® Provider Rewards Program. Points will be earned for specific program-related activities and can be redeemed for items such as gift cards, physical activity equipment, active play books, etc. Even if you’ve participated in the former version of this training previously, you can join us for this new and improved learning event and receive the new activity kit! ***NEW RULE-*** Each center that is represented at a Be Active Kids training (by one or more lead teacher) will receive 1 Movement Guide Kit. Additional Movement Guide Kits are provided for free after completing the 1 and 3 month post training usage survey from the Be Active Kids website.

Pediatric Asthma Control & Prevention

By working together, parents and their child’s doctor/nurse can design and follow a step-by-step plan for living with asthma and preventing attacks.

Choosing and Using an Approved Curriculum

This five hour course will provide participants working in early care and education settings with guidelines for selecting and planning to implement a North Carolina approved curriculum for children birth to five.

ECERS-R Overview (Preschool)

An overview for the preschool rating scales that will include the assessment scored indicators and tips for a better ECERS-R Score.

Asthma Education Curriculum for Child Care Providers

Learn what asthma is, along with its signs, symptoms, and trigger factors. Also know how to manage effectively this common illness in the early child hood setting.

How Are You? How Am I?

Most preschool teachers are diligent about introducing their students to a large variety of literature and pre-literacy activities. But emotional literacy – the ability to identify, understand and respond to emotions in yourself and others in a healthy manner – is even more basic to school readiness. We'll examine the many benefits to children who gain a strong foundation in emotional literacy, explore simple ways in which you can foster emotional literacy in your classroom, and share some excellent resources for tools and activities teachers can incorporate into their daily classroom curriculum to make intentional teaching of emotions fun and easy.

Playground Safety

Playgrounds are a fundamental part of the childhood experience. A playground should be safe at all times to allow children to develop progressively and test their skills by providing a series of graduated challenges.

Anxiety in Young Children

Many anxieties and fears are normal. Anxiety is defined as apprehension without apparent cause. It usually occurs when there's no immediate threat to a person's safety or wellbeing, and the threat feels real.

Inclusion - Together is Better!

Inclusion happens when a child successfully engages with his/her peers in routines or activities with only the amount of adult support needed. Let's discuss the practices of inclusion and how to make them work for all children.

BSAC (Basic School Age Care)

Participants will engage in hands on activities throughout the training that will reinforce health and safety practices, create and promote learning environments that meet all children's developmental needs that foster positive behavior and identify Quality Elements of School Age Care.

P-CAN

Prevention of child abuse and neglect training. Prepares providers to be a resource for parents

Medication Administration in Child Care Part 1 & 2

This training comes with Part 1 and Part 2 and provides comprehensive but detailed best practice principles on how to accurately administer medications to children in a child care setting. This training is designed for all child care providers. Upon completion of this course, child care providers will be able to administer medications with confidence and perform within the scope of Federal and State Laws in a child care setting. Participants are required to attend both Part 1 and Part 2 to complete the training hours.

ITS-SIDS

Learn how to provide a safe sleep environment for infants in a childcare setting. Training is required every three years and within four months of hire for staff and volunteers, and family childcare homes providers licensed to care for infants.

Pre-K CLASS Observer Introduction

Introduction to the Pre-K CLASS observation tool and the way it organizes effective teacher-child interactions. Includes an overview of observation and coding skills and how this information can be used to improve teacher effectiveness within the classroom.

Medication Administration

Children & Youth Partnership for Dare County Training Descriptions

Hand Washing Procedures and Communicable Diseases in Child Care

Proper handwashing is the best way to protect against many illnesses, including the common cold to more serious infections. After attending this training, participants will increase their awareness of common communicable diseases, learn how illnesses are spread in the child care setting and gain tips on how to reduce the spread of illnesses to keep children healthy. We will review when handwashing is required as well as strategies and tips for teaching proper handwashing and other healthy hygiene habits to young children.

American Heart Association CPR and First Aid for adults, children and infants.

Class will be taught through lecture, discussion, video, and skills practice. Certification cards will be given to participants successfully passing written tests and skills demonstration.

When Books POP off the Paper: Building Social Emotional & Early Literacy/Writing Skills

Books are standard materials in most classrooms, but are we getting the most out of them? How intentional is our choice of books, the way we read books, and the way we expand children's learning through books? In this session we will discuss how building literacy skills (including emotional literacy) is critical for young children, define best practices in early literacy and writing, explore books and "Book Nooks" from the Center on the Social and Emotional Foundations for Early Learning (CSEFEL), and create expansion activities for additional children's books that will not only enhance children's learning in the classroom but will make it fun for you and for them! Discover new books and take home activities that you can immediately begin using! *Accepted by DCDEE as 5 contact hours toward training requirements.* (0.5 CEU)

Introduction to Cultural Competence: Awareness

Children from diverse backgrounds need to be cared for in early learning environments that provide experiences that reflect their cultural backgrounds, which include family values and learning styles. This course is a beginning step to increasing awareness and understanding of culture and cultural competence. It focuses on defining culture, cultural conditioning and culturally responsive teaching and the role of engaging families. It is designed to be interactive and self-reflective.

Recertification Class - American Heart Association Adult, Child, & Infant CPR and First Aid

You must have valid certification up to the month of recertification. CPR and First Aid for adults, children and infants will be reviewed. Certification cards will be sent to participants successfully passing written tests and skills demonstration.

ITS-SIDS

Learn how to provide a safe sleep environment for infants in a childcare setting. Training is required every three years and within four months of hire for staff and volunteers, and family childcare homes providers licensed to care for infants.

Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR) in Child Care Training

Be prepared! Knowing what to do before, during and after an emergency is a critical part of being prepared and may make all the difference when seconds count. The NEW Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR) rules went into effect July 1, 2015. NC Child Care Rules 10A NCAC 09 .0607(b) and 10A NCAC 09 .1705(b)(6) require that a designated individual from all licensed centers and family child care homes complete the EPR in Child Care training before July 2017 and submit a facility EPR Plan online within four months of attending the training. The training provides early educators with information and tools to prepare for many types of emergencies. It addresses the new NC Child Care Rules on emergency preparedness, current best practice recommendations, and guidance on completing the online EPR Plan. The training is presented in two 2-hour sessions and includes a one-hour site assignment. Bodies and Potties: Body Consciousness and Potty Training for Infants and Toddlers

One way children learn about their world is through their bodies and physical experiences. Learning about their bodies is no exception. We will discuss strategies for how to talk with young children appropriately as they become more aware of their bodies and its parts beyond just their fingers and toes. Part of developing this "body consciousness" includes the potty training process. The signs that children are ready to start the transition from diapers to using the potty will be shared as well as guidelines and strategies for successful potty training experiences. This training provides information that supports the ITERS-R subscales: Personal Care Routines, Listening and Talking, Interactions and Program Structure.

Hertford/Northampton Training Descriptions

CPR/First Aid

Participants will learn how to perform CPR/First Aid. They will learn the rules and regulations for administering both. Participants taking this training for the first time should inform the trainer during registration.

ITS SIDS-Sudden Infant Death Syndrome

Learn how to provide a safe sleep environment for infants in a child care setting. Training is required every three years and within four months of hire for staff, volunteers, and family child care home providers licensed to care for infants.

Utilizing the DCDEE Handbook

Come learn how to find what you are looking for on the DCDEE Site.

Foundations of Inclusion

This training provides an overview of inclusion in early childhood research based practices and actions that early childhood education professionals might take to build on a high quality inclusion program.

New Provider Orientation (Potential Providers Only)

Overview of the requirements for starting a family child care facility. Participants will receive a licensing application packet and helpful information on preparing their home for the initial licensing visit.

Choosing and Using An Approved Curriculum

This training will give an overview of information for the NC approved curriculum for those working in early care and education settings, with guidelines for choosing an approved curriculum for children birth to age five. The training will also provide information on formative assessment strategies with the approved curriculum.

PLAY: An Intervention for Challenging Behavior

In this session, we will PLAY as we discuss the importance of play for all children, how play can serve as an intervention for children with challenging behavior, Dr. Stanley Greenspan's Floor time concept, how play meets developmentally appropriate learning goals, and creative ways teachers can explain the importance of play to parents.

Emergency Preparedness and Response in Child Care Training

Emergency preparedness and response (EPR) rules went into effect July 1, 2015. The rules are designed to assist licensed child care programs to be adequately prepared to respond to the needs of children and others in the event of disasters and emergencies. Participants will learn more about the rules and the required emergency preparedness and response plan.

NC Foundations for Early Learning and Development

This 5 hour course will provide participants with an introduction to Foundations, North Carolina's new Early Learning and Development expectations, how they are structured, and how to implement them in early childhood settings.

Child Abuse and Neglect

Participants will learn how to recognize and report child abuse and neglect.

Music and Movement

Music is an exciting part of a child's developmental growth. Participants will learn different musical activities that will encourage children to dance and sing or just move their bodies. Come prepared to move and have lots of fun!!!

When Books POP off the Paper: Building Social Emotional & Early Literacy/Writing Skills

In this session, we will discuss how building literacy skills (emotional literacy) is critical for young children, define best practices in early literacy and writing, explore books, and "Book Nooks" from the Center on the Social and Emotional Foundations for Early Learning, and create expansion activities for additional children's books that will not only enhance children's learning in the classroom but will make it fun for you and for them!

Designing High Quality Infant/Toddler Care Environments

In some settings you feel relaxed, comfortable, and free to open up and be yourself. In other places you feel formal, stiff, and a little on guard. In thoughtfully planned environments children feel a sense of belonging and security. The child's care environment conveys messages about what is okay and what is not, what is expected or allowed, and what is encouraged. We will explore the second level of the CSEFEL Pyramid Model in order to understand how to design high quality environments to meet the needs of infants and toddlers.

Planning the Environment for Children Success

Participants will learn how important it is to plan the learning environment to be exciting and educational for young children.

Ready, Set, Play Your Way to School Readiness

Participants will learn more about school readiness and early childhood skills.

Chowan/Perquimans Training Descriptions

Creative Outdoor Learning Environment

Almost all children require medication at some point of time. What does NC law say about giving medication in Child Care? What about children with Asthma? What about children with Diabetes? Come learn to safely administer medication and meet the needs of children in your facility
